1. The Old Brick School House

At special times of the year this school house is opened and 4th grade students are invited to attend an old-fashioned school for the day.

2. Robert Frost Home

This man was a world famous poet who lived here and taught at Pinkerton Academy. One of his well known poems is "Stopping by the Woods on a Snowy Evening."

3. Concord Coach

In 1813 Lewis Downing founded a wagon factory that eventually built the Concord Coaches, used for commercial and pleasure vehicles around the world.

4. Shaker Village

In 1792 a community of Shakers organized in the Township of Canterbury. These people developed High standards and efficient ways to farm and make their crafts.

5. Amoskeag Mills

The world famous mills were built in Manchester along a canal. The 64 mills covered a mile and a half of ground and produced 500,000 yards of cloth each week.

6. Molly Stark Cannon

In 1777 General John Stark captured "Old Molly" at the Battle of Bennington. It has A permanent home in New Boston.

7. New Hampshire Canal System

Before the railroads were built in New Hampshire, people used an extensive canal system along the falls of the Merrimack River. Remains of locks, towpaths, loading stations and other remnants can still be seen.
