NHSN Enrollment Update (as of December 15, 2016):

6,750 Hospitals (this includes 531 Long-term Acute Care Hospitals and 338 Free-standing Inpatient Rehabilitation Facilities)

6,870 Outpatient Hemodialysis Facilities

4,803 Ambulatory Surgery Centers (ASCs)

1,867 Long-term Care Facilities

20,290 Total Healthcare Facilities Enrolled

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
